Start A	5569 181A Street	Samuel Howard Shannon House Built ca. 1910 for Samuel Shannon (son of Thomas Shannon, the first mayor (reeve) of Surrey. Thomas Shannon, and his two brothers, were the earliest settlers in the area). Samuel Shannon was awarded the Order of the British Empire in 1943.
В	5818 182 Street	<u>Cecil Heppell House</u> Built in 1928. Cecil Heppell worked for the Municipality of Surrey for 44 years, until 1964.
	5720 182 Street	<u>Thomas L. Lawrence House</u> Built ca. 1930
	5678 182 Street	<u>Creelman House</u> Built ca.1936 and is an unusual and sophisticated example of period revival styles of the 1920s and 1930s. Barry Creelman was a long-time manager of the Surrey Co-op business in Cloverdale.
	5634 182 Street	Robert D. MacKenzie House (1922) Robert MacKenzie was Reeve of Surrey from 1921 to 1923. MacKenzie's earlier house (1911) was at <u>5418 184 Street</u>
С	17857 56 Avenue	Cloverdale Elementary School Built in 1921 with many future additions. The first public school in Surrey opened in 1882 at near today's 176 St and 60 Ave.

D	17710 56A Avenue	Old Anniedale School One of Surrey's first schools (built 1891) and the oldest still standing (originally at 96 Ave and 184 St). <u>1881 Town Hall</u> Surrey's first Town Hall, built in 1881 and in use until 1912, originally located across from Christ Church on Old McLellan Rd
		<u>Anderson Cabin</u> Built ca. 1872, it is documented as Surrey's oldest remaining building (moved from its original location).
	17671 56 Avenue	<u>1912 Municipal Hall</u> The history of this building is one of evolution and re-use – from Surrey's municipal hall (1912) to Surrey Archives (current) and many other uses in between.
E	Northwest corner of 176 Street and Highway 10	Pacific Highway Stone Marker The Pacific Highway opened August 3, 1923 and provided improved vehicular access north and south to the U.S. border.
F	5657 176 Street	Dann's Electronics (Royal Bank of Canada) Built as a branch of the Royal Bank of Canada in 1920. Occupied by Dann's Electronics from 1932 to 2013. Site currently used for Netflix show, Sabrina.
	5679 176 Street	Bank of Montreal Built in 1912 and occupied by the bank until 1958
	5723 176 Street	<u>Highway Garage</u> Opened as a garage in 1920.
	5732 176 Street	<u>The Clova Theatre</u> Built in 1947, one of the first modern buildings in Cloverdale
	5733 176 Street	<u>Cloverdale Hotel</u>
G	17725 58A Ave	Dr. Sinclair House Built ca. 1900 and home to Dr. Sinclair, who was the Municipal Medical Health Officer from 1911 to his death in 1952.
Н	17826 59A Ave	Ross House Craftsman bungalow, built ca. 1925
I	5962 180 Street	James William White House Built ca. 1940. Lack of detailing is characteristic of the rationing of building materials during the war.
J End	18076 58 Ave	Whitely House Constructed ca. 1920
