Pursuant to paragraph 7(2) of the said Act, The City of Surrey has deposited with the Minister of Transport, on the on-line Navigable Waters Registry (http://cps.canada.ca/) and under registry number 6532, or, under the NPP File Number 2022-507949 a description of the following work, its site and plans:

Testing a small-scale salt marsh enhancement project referred to as S1 Pilot which is part of the larger Coastal Foreshore Enhancement Project, a joint undertaking by the City of Surrey, City of Delta, and Semiahmoo First Nation. The S1 Pilot is located approximately 170 m east of the Eugene Creek floodbox extending 320 m to the east following the northern shoreline of Mud Bay. The enhancement project sits entirely within the provincially-controlled Boundary Bay Wildlife Management Area in front of the Colebrook Sea Dyke.
