The Council met pursuant to adjournment.
 All of the members were present with the
 exception of Councillor Shepherd.

Moved by Councillor Adams
 Seconded by Councillor Johnston
 That the minutes of the meetings of November 22nd and
 November 27th be respectively adopted as read.

Carried

A large delegation representing property owners on the
 West side of that portion of Pacific Highway between Brown Road and the Nicomekl
 River - Came before the Council and presented a petition requesting that the ditch
 along the said highway fronting their properties be cleaned out and deepened to carry
 the water flowing from the hill and so prevent flooding and damage of their various
 properties.

Considerable discussion ensued during which it was stated
 that Mr. Beamish, one of the signatories to the petition, had signed same on the
 condition that the spoil from the ditch would not be placed on his land - or if
 placed on his land, be levelled off.

Councillor Kuhn also drew attention to the necessity of
 cleaning the ditch on the West side of Pacific Highway from the Bamford Road to the
 Campbell River Road.

The Clerk was instructed to take both of these matters up
 with the Provincial Public Works Department to ascertain if their assistance could
 be obtained in this connection.

The delegation then withdrew.

Mr. Floyd Smith - Came before the Council in connection with
 his application for a contract to slash the brush from portion of Walden Road West
 of Archibald Road adjoining his property.

It was pointed out that as there was little likelihood of
 this road being required for some time to come, work done on it would be of little
 value.

The Council undertook to contact Mr. Smith in the event of
 any work becoming necessary in the vicinity of his home.

Some discussion arose during which Councillor Bishop
 reported that he had accepted, in conjunction with the Engineer, an offer to carry
 out some slashing on the Kennedy Road.

Several of the members censured this action and a general
 debate followed regarding the work done by Mr. Doig. He was working without super-
 vision of the Municipal Engineer. Mr. Bishop reiterated that the Engineer was aware
 of the work being done by Mr. Doig and this in his opinion the work carried out was
 necessary and valuable.

Mr. John G. Farmer, representing Mr. Robert Frederick Allen -
 Came before the Council in connection with his client's application for partial
 cancellation of portion of Maple Street lying between Lot 2, Block 1, D.L. 52, Gp. 2,
 Map 2482 and the Great Northern Railway Company right-of-way.

COUNCILLOR SHEPHERD TOOK HIS SEAT AT THIS POINT IN THE MEETING.

Mr. Farmer reported that his client had now acquired all of

the property in the block which was effected by the 12 foot right-of-way and that his client now proposed to cancel the road entirely.

Considerable discussion followed during which Councillor Adams reported that the Crescent Beach Property Owners' Association had withdrawn its objection to the proposed cancellation.

Further debate ensued.

Moved by Councillor Atchison

Seconded by Councillor Johnston

That the Council agree to the total cancellation of that portion of Maple Street lying between Lot 2, Block 1, D.L. 52, Group 2, Map 2482 and the Great Northern Railway right-of-way.

The motion was declared carried, Councillor Adams recording a dissenting vote.

Mrs. Carole Lucas, accompanied by her husband - Waited upon the Council and complained bitterly regarding flooding condition affecting their property on Westminster Road.

Mr. Lucas spoke to some length and stated that approximately 3½ feet of water covered the property last Saturday night and that their efforts to obtain relief through the various municipal officials contacted had been without result.

A lengthy debate ensued during which it was pointed out that the Provincial Public Works Department was partially responsible for water brought to Westminster Road and it was arranged that the Municipal Engineer and Councillor Bishop would take the matter up with the District Engineer, Provincial Department of Public Works, to see what could be worked out to remedy the condition.

Councillor McPherson expressed his disapproval of the manner in which Mr. Lucas had addressed the Reeve and Council.

Mrs. Lucas stated that approximately 1½ tons of alfalfa hay and two units of sawdust had been spoiled by the water and she enquired who will pay the damage. It was stated that the Municipality could assume no responsibility in this connection.

After further debate Mr. & Mrs. Lucas withdrew.

MATTERS REFERRED FROM PREVIOUS MEETINGS FOR REPORT OR RECOMMENDATION WERE CONSIDERED AND DEALT WITH AS FOLLOWS:

Mrs. W. Werbecki - Complaining of drainage of her property - Lot 27, Section 25, Block 5N, Range 2W, Map 625 - on Kerfoot Road.

Referred to the incoming Council.

Clerk to advise that weather conditions and condition of the soil make it impossible to carry out any work this year.

Messrs. Fenn & Watson, representing the Port Kells Fire Department Regarding alterations to building - stating it was impossible to provide adequate facilities for drying of hose, etc.

Referred to the incoming Council.

Emil Pobuda - Requesting attention to road leading to his property - Lot 1, Block 26, Section 11, Block 5N, Range 2W, Map 8948.

Councillor Bishop reported that his Ward Foreman had the matter in hand.

Clerk was instructed to drop the matter from the Agenda.

Board of Park Commissioners- Request for lowering or relocating of the culvert through the B. C. Electric Railway right-of-way at Sullivan Park.

Clerk was instructed to advise the Parks Board that funds are not available to undertake the work requested this year.

F. J. Minaker and T. A. Stevenson - Offering \$7.00 per thousand feet of merchantable timber located on municipally owned property in the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 22, Tp. 1, and advising that there is approximately 50,000 feet of timber on the property.

Moved by Councillor Adams

Seconded by Councillor McPherson

That this Council accept a flat price of \$350.00 from Messrs. Minaker and Stevenson for the timber on the municipally owned property on the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 22, Tp. 1, and that they be given six months dating from January 1st, 1949, for removal of the timber from the property.

Carried

Bevan L. Hugh - Suggesting that the Council establish a building line on Buena Vista Avenue, between Finlay Street and Johnston Road to permit widening of road to full 66 feet at some future date.

Councillor McPherson reported that the Engineer and he had gone into the matter and suggested that buildings be required to be set back 25 feet from the property line.

Superintendent of Motor Carriers, Public Utilities Commission - Advising of receipt of an application by Mr. Eivind O. Falck for permission to establish an additional taxi stand in vicinity of the South end of Pattullo Bridge.

Clerk to advise that the Council will raise no objection to the granting of a license to Mr. Falck for the establishment of an additional taxi stand at the South end of the Pattullo Bridge.

Delegation of property owners on Holly Road between Ewenson Road and Bose Road - Requesting completion of Holly Road through to Bose Road with a crossing over the B. C. Electric right-of-way.

Clerk was instructed to take the matter up with the B. C. Electric Railway Company with the view of obtaining a crossing over the Company's right-of-way from the end of Holly Road to Bose Road.

Municipal Fire Inspection Officer - Re loaning of fire truck to Newton District.

Councillor Johnston reported that he had contacted several of the organizations at Newton with the view of organizing a voluntary fire brigade, but so far had been unsuccessful.

Councillor McPherson, on behalf of the Labour and Equipment Committee, reported re cement floor for Municipal Garage.

Some discussion ensued during which it was suggested that an asphalt floor might be installed at less cost than cement, but after consideration it was decided that this type of flooring might not prove satisfactory.

Moved by Councillor McPherson

Seconded by Councillor Kuhn

That a cement floor be installed in the Municipal Garage.

Carried

The method by which the cement floor in the garage would be installed was referred to the Board of Works Committee of the Council for consideration.

Moved by Councillor Bishop

Seconded by Councillor Shepherd

That the Council adjourn for lunch to reconvene at 1:15 p.m.

Carried

At 1:15 p.m. the Council reconvened as per motion for adjournment. All of the members were present.

CORRESPONDENCE WAS READ AND DEALT WITH AS FOLLOWS:

Mrs. Bertha La France Lester - Stating that as there is no culvert at the end of Argyle Drive it is impossible for traffic to get through to

Brentwood Drive and requesting that this culvert be installed and that the drainage be given attention.

Councillor Bishop reported that the Ward Foreman was going into the matter to see what could be done to alleviate the condition complained of.

Kee Lam - With enquiry as to purchase price of Lots 79 to 88 inclusive, Block 6, Section 36, Block 5N, Range 3W, Map 529A.

The Clerk was instructed to advise that the property in question was not for sale at the present time.

Harry S. Baker - Advising of stoppage in the road ditch on Archibald Road adjoining his property, which caused his basement to fill with water, causing damage. Stating that he had been forced to clean out the ditch himself and that he was submitting his account for payment for the work done by him in this connection.

Councillor Johnston reported that the Engineer was attending to this matter.

The correspondence was ordered filed.

Some discussion ensued regarding the condition in which municipal roads and ditches were left by bulldozing contractors during land clearing operations.

Moved by Councillor McPherson

Seconded by Councillor Adams

That the Municipal Engineer be instructed to notify all bulldozer operators operating in the District that municipal roads and ditches must not be interfered with and must be left in a satisfactory condition after land clearing operations are completed.

Carried

Newton Branch, Canadian Legion, B.E.S.L. - Expressing appreciation for work already done in opening up Churchill Avenue to give access to their premises and suggesting that in order to maintain the access over the road during the coming winter it will be necessary to place some more gravel on the road and also to give some attention to the ditches. Also stating that it was understood that an eight inch culvert was to have been placed in the ditch immediately in front of the hall.

Councillor Johnston reported that this request was receiving attention.

Floyd Smith - Re brushing Walden Road from the Archibald Road - West.

Mr. Smith was present at the meeting during the morning session. The letter was ordered filed.

B. C. Bracewell, Inspector of Municipalities, - Enclosing copy of a letter from John Reid.

The letter of Mr. John Reid was referred to the incoming Council for consideration.

The Clerk was instructed to acknowledge receipt and to advise him that his complaint will receive consideration by the next year's Council, as weather conditions made it impossible to undertake any work in this area at the present time.

Superintendent of Bank of Montreal - Drawing attention to inadequate drainage facilities for the new bank building in Cloverdale and requesting that this be given early attention.

Clerk was instructed to advise that there was nothing that could be done to provide temporary relief of the condition complained of. A petition was

being circulated at the present time with the view of obtaining the consent of all the property owners affected to a local improvement scheme which it is hoped would provide an adequate solution of the problem.

Albert Lorentsen - Drawing attention to drainage condition existing on North Bluff Road between the Langley boundary and the Campbell River and suggesting that unless something is done immediately to remedy this situation, further steps will be taken. Also stating that this stretch of North Bluff Road has received no gravel for the past three years or more.

Councillor Kuhn reported that approximately 400 yards of ditching would be required to carry the water from the Langley boundary to the Campbell River.

Some discussion ensued and the Reeve undertook to discuss the matter with the Reeve of Langley Municipality with the view of obtaining assistance from that Municipality in view of the quantity of water carried down the hill from there and left to overflow on the property on the Surrey side of the boundary.

The Clerk was instructed to advise Mr. Lorentsen accordingly and also to advise that the matter of gravelling North Bluff Road will be considered by next year's Council.

Mrs. Marjorie J. Lundie - Requesting that tree on side of Welch Road near Howard be cut down as it is endangering her house.
Referred to the Engineer for attention.

Councillor Adams reported on arrangements he had made with Messrs. Minaker and Stevenson for removal of several dangerous trees at Crescent.

Councillor McPherson drew attention to a commitment made by the Municipal Council in connection with application made by residents of Stayte Road for improvement of that strip of road and stated that the Council was obligated to undertake certain improvement work this year.

He also drew attention to the White Rock Sewerage System and enquired when a start would be made to instal same.

Some discussion ensued during which the Reeve stated that the disposal plant should be installed as soon as possible and it was decided to discuss this matter at the next meeting of the Board of Works Committee.

Councillor McPherson also reported that he had received a request for permission to slash and prepare that portion of Finlay Street lying between Buena Vista Avenue and North Bluff Road for clearing in return for the wood on the road allowance, the applicant undertaking to burn all the slashing on the road.

Councillor McPherson was authorized to permit the applicant to carry out the work on the terms stated.

W. B. Aitken - Advising of his intention of becoming a candidate to the Board of School Trustees for District No. 36, and stating that he had been interested in municipal affairs for the past sixteen years.

Ordered filed.

Douglas A. Conrad - Drawing attention/the number of fires which have occurred recently in the vicinity of his home at 191 Pike Road and requesting permission to erect a fire siren on his property for use in case of fire, accident, etc., which would warrant assistance from his neighbours, and would be for the use of the area two miles north, south, east and west of his premises.
Clerk to advise that the Council would raise no objection if the residents in the vicinity were in favour and also to point out that the

properties lying East of Pike Road were included in the Port Kells Fire Protection Area.

Commissioner of Provincial Police - Acknowledging receipt of letter of November 23rd with reference to the imposition of a speed limit of 35 miles per hour on Scott Road, advising that this matter is at present under investigation and upon receipt of the necessary information, he will advise of action taken.

Ordered filed.

Hughes & MacKenzie - Returning accounts for repairs to Chief Moffat's care and advising that in view of the fact that the damage was done by one of the Corporation's own vehicles the Insurance Company has no liability in this connection.

Some discussion arose regarding the insurance coverage on the municipal fleet of vehicles and it was stated that the insurance coverage was not adequate in view of the fact that a collision between two of the municipal vehicles might result in considerable loss without any insurance coverage.

The Clerk was instructed to discuss this matter with the agents of the Insurance Company.

Secretary, New Westminster Harbour Commissioners - Advising that his Board will be pleased to meet a committee of the Council in the Commissioners' office on Monday, December 13th at 10 a.m.

Clerk was instructed to advise that the date mentioned was satisfactory to the Council.

B. C. Electric Railway Company Limited - Advising that the question of improving service to the northern portion of Surrey is receiving the attention of the Company's engineers who hope to bring about an improvement in the near future.

Correspondence ordered filed.

Considerable discussion ensued regarding the quality of the electric service rendered by the B. C. Electric Railway Company Limited throughout the District.

B. C. Motor Transportation Limited - Acknowledging receipt of letter of November 29th and advising that after discussing the matter referred to with the Public Utilities Commission it had been suggested that trip number 6412 - leaving Vancouver at 11:45 a.m. be extended to Endersby to arrive at that point at 1:10 p.m. and that the trip number 6411, due to leave Newton at 1:05 p.m. for Vancouver leave Endersby at 2:25 p.m., arriving at Vancouver at 3:50 p.m. Requesting to be advised as soon as possible if this proposal meets with the approval of the Council.

The Clerk was instructed to forward a copy of correspondence in this connection to Mr. A. E. Owen, who presented the petition from the residents of the Colebrook area at the last meeting of the Council, and also to advise the Public Utilities Commission that the proposal submitted by the B. C. Motor Transportation Limited meets with the Council's approval.

Superintendent of Motor Carriers, Public Utilities Commission - Acknowledging receipt of letter of November 29th and enclosed petition and advising that the matter referred to had been taken up with the B. C. Motor Transportation Limited and that this Company will submit specific proposals to the Council for consideration.

Correspondence ordered filed.

Superintendent of Motor Carriers, Public Utilities Commission - Advising of receipt of a copy of proposals made by the B. C. Motor Transportation Limited with reference to service on their route to Endersby and asking that he be advised of the Council's reaction to same as quickly as possible.

Correspondence ordered filed.

Superintendent of Motor Carriers, Public Utilities Commission Enclosing a copy of a letter written by him to the Secretary of the Crescent Beach Property Owners' Association in which he advises that the Commission had accepted the fare structure proposed by the B. C. Motor Transportation for its route to Crescent Beach.

Correspondence ordered filed.

Mrs. E. M. Phillips - Enquiring when water service to the 200 Block on Scott Road can definitely be expected.

Referred to the Clerk for reply.

Mr. & Mrs. W. L. Michael - Expressing appreciation for permission given them to obtain water service to their premises.

Correspondence ordered filed.

Assistant Provincial Health Officer - Advising that consideration is being given to the placing of a Sanitary Inspector in the Municipality with headquarters at Cloverdale and requesting an opportunity to discuss this matter with the Reeve and Chairman of the Health Committee.

It was arranged that the Health Committee of the Council would meet at the Municipal Hall on Friday, the 10th inst., at 8 p.m.

The Clerk was instructed to advise the Assistant Provincial Health Officer accordingly.

City of Blaine - With copies of proposed agreement to sell water to the District of Surrey.

Moved by Councillor Shepherd

Seconded by Councillor Kuhn

That the Reeve and Clerk be and they are hereby authorized to execute an Agreement with the City of Blaine, Washington, for the supplying of water for the Douglas Area Waterworks System and that the Clerk be instructed to obtain the consent of the Foreign Exchange Control Board to the execution of this Agreement.

Councillor Kuhn submitted a letter received from Mr. Harold Paulson in which he stated that eight of the owners in that portion of Kells Road running North of North Bluff Road were prepared to contribute the sum of \$10.00 each towards the cost of slashing and opening approximately one half mile of said road.

He stated that 16 foot wide clearing was all that would be required on the said municipal boundary line. The proposal being made contingent upon the road being built by Christmas of this year.

The matter was referred to Councillor Kuhn and the Engineer for investigation and report.

CLERK'S REPORTS:

The plan of superannuation for over-age employees presented by the London Life Assurance Company earlier in the year was brought up for discussion. Considerable discussion ensued.

After some debate Councillor Adams withdrew his motion with the consent of Councillor Atchison.

That the Resolution passed at the meeting of July 5th, 1948, deferring action on the Plan of Superannuation coverage for over-age employees pending negotiation of a new wage agreement with the Surrey Employees' Association be rescinded and that the matter be considered fully at the next meeting of the Municipal Council.

Carried

The Clerk reported that the Statutory Hearing in connection with the Special Survey of the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ Section 29, Tp. 7, would be held in the Land Registry Office, New Westminster, December 15th.

The matter was referred to the Municipal Engineer for attention.

The Engineer presented an offer submitted by Mr. Andrew Waterman, 1950 Stokes Road, R. R. 2, White Rock, B. C., to slash and prepare for bulldozing the unopened portion of Stokes Road lying between Coast Meridian and Stayte Roads for the sum of \$200.00.
