

Municipal Hall,
Cloverdale, B. C.
July 26th, 1948.

The Council met pursuant to adjournment. All the members were present with the exception of Councillors Shepherd and Kuhn.

Moved by Councillor Adams
Seconded by Councillor Atchison

That the minutes of the meeting of July 5th and a special meeting of July 19th be respectively adopted as read.

Carried

Mr. C. W. Bradley and a delegation - Came before the Council and stated that he had received legal advise that the Council was not in a position to withhold the granting of a municipal building permit for alteration of the Anglican Church premises into a funeral parlour undertaking establishment.

Councillor Kuhn took his seat at this point in the meeting.

Mr. Bradley spoke to some length and pointed out that he had been permitted to occupy portion of "E" Street for the past ten years and requested that the development that he had undertaken on this street be left intact and that the road be closed and he be given a lease at a nominal rental of \$1.00 per year.

Councillor Shepherd took his seat at this point in the meeting.

Considerable discussion ensued during which Mr. Hill, owner of the premises to the East of the Church property, pointed out that the church building covered the entire lot and that when work was done on the building his property had to be encroached on.

After further discussion it was decided that Councillor McPherson and the Engineer would look into the matter further.

Mr. S. S. Finson and a delegation representing property owners on the Liverpool Road section of Brownsville Water Area - Waited on the Council in connection with their request for temporary water service.

The Reeve stated that 1000 feet of 1½" galvanized water pipe had been ordered and would be delivered on Tuesday, next. It was arranged that the Assistant Engineer would stake out the location for the trench for the water pipe and that property owners concerned would dig the necessary trench.

After further discussion the delegation withdrew.

Mr. P. J. Gordy - Came before the Council and requested that Gordy Road, off Northline Road, be extended south a distance of 300 feet before the rainy season commenced.

Referred to Councillor Bishop and the Engineer for investigation.

Mr. Frank Jagerhofer - Came before the Council in connection with his application to purchase the timber off municipally owned blocks in Port Mann townsite.

After some discussion it transpired that the property referred to was partially in Sections 4 & 5, Block 5N, Range 1W, It was pointed out that Section 5 was privately owned and Mr. Jagerhofer was advised to re-investi-

gate the property and submit an alternative offer for consideration at the next meeting of the Council.

Mr. A. C. Mason - Came before the Council and enquired if it would be possible for him and the adjoining property owners to obtain water service from the water mains of the Sunnyside Waterworks System if they were to install their own pipe line.

Some discussion ensued during which Councillor McPherson pointed out that the water supply was adequate and Mr. Mason was informed that he could obtain a water supply from this source on the terms set out in the Waterworks By-law.

Mr. Mason enquired if there were any municipal regulations restricting the use of his property - Lots 18 & 19, ptn. NE $\frac{1}{4}$ Section 22, Tp. 1, Map 8888 as he intended to establish a pig ranch for the raising of certified Yorkshire hogs.

This matter was referred to the Sanitary Inspector for investigation and report.

A delegation representing property owners on portion of Stayte Road between King George Highway and Campbell River Road - Waited on the Council and strongly objected to the Council's proposal that one half of the cost of the hard-surfacing of this portion of Stayte Road be borne by the resident property owners.

Mr. Dixon Wood, spokesman for the delegation, drew attention to promises made by former members of the Municipal Council and pointed out that this road bore a substantial portion of the traffic entering White Rock. He stated that a traffic check indicated that between 400 and 450 vehicles passed over this road on week days - one half of which were commercial vehicles and that between 600 and 700 vehicles passed over it on Sundays. He stated that between 15 and 18 cars only were owned by residents on the road and that these residents should not be required to bear a major portion of the expense of hard-surfacing the road.

A lengthy discussion ensued during which the Reeve pointed out the needs of other sections of the Municipality and that efforts were being made to induce the Provincial Government to bear a substantial portion of the cost of improving the access into White Rock by way of Johnston Road. He stated that it would not be advisable to pave two roads into White Rock in one year at the expense of the remainder of the Municipality.

Some discussion ensued regarding the advisability of carrying out this work as a local improvement and spreading the cost over a number of years.

It was suggested that the road be oiled to alleviate the dust nuisance and that arrangement be made to hard surface it next year.

Some objection to this was voiced and it was finally decided to refer this matter to a committee consisting of Councillors Kuhn, Adams and McPherson to negotiate with the Stayte Road Property Owners' Association and come to an agreement before the next meeting of the Council.

K. Grubert - Came before the Council in connection with his application to purchase 8 municipally owned lots in Block 3, Section 36, Elock 5N, Range 3W, Map 529A.

Some discussion ensued and the matter was referred to Councillor Shepherd and the Engineer for investigation and report.

Moved by Councillor Johnston
Seconded by Councillor Shepherd

That the Council adjourn for lunch to reconvene at 2 p.m.

Carried

Councillor Atchison extended an invitation to the members of the Council to view a demonstration of a mobile power shovel in the Chicken-Wilson gravel pit during the luncheon recess.

The members agreed to attend this demonstration.

The Council reconvened as per motion for adjournment. All of the members were present with the exception of Councillor Kuhn.

Mr. J. T. Brown, representing the Colebrook Dyking District - Came before the Council and requested that the dyke on the Western boundary of the Dyking District which was now used as a road be brought up to required height. He produced an estimate prepared by Messrs. Burnett & McGugan, consulting engineers for the Dyking District, showing an estimate of 975 yards of material required to bring the dyke up to the required height.

Councillor Kuhn took his seat at this point in the meeting.

Some discussion on Mr. Brown's request ensued and the matter was referred to Councillor Adams and the Engineer for investigation and report.

Messrs. H. Osborne and C.W.O. King - Came before the Council in connection with the petition forwarded previously in connection with rowdyism and vandalism, etc., taking place in White Rock during the week-ends, especially on Saturday nights.

A lengthy discussion ensued during which several members of the Council expressed their opinion that police action was necessary to remedy the situation.

Moved by Councillor McPherson

Seconded by Councillor Kuhn

That the petition presented in this connection be referred to the Board of Police Commissioners with the request that it receive immediate attention.

Carried

Messrs. McDonald and Rawlings, representing Sunnyside Community Association - Came before the Council and requested attention to drainage ditches on Sunnyside Road between Stayte and King George Highway.

Referred to Councillor Adams and the Engineer for investigation.

Mr. Rawlings, before withdrawing from the meeting, expressed his appreciation for the parks provided for the public by the Council and the Board of Park Commissioners. He suggested that the Council consider the construction of a speed corner at the intersection of Johnston Road and Sunnyside Road and stated that he and a number of the property owners in the district would be prepared to contribute some of the cost of acquiring the necessary property.

He also suggested that a similar corner be constructed at Campbell River Road and King George Highway.

Mr. McDonald drew attention to condition of the intersection of the King George Highway and Constable Road and pointed out that the brush should be cut to improve visibility. Councillor Kuhn reported that this was receiving attention.

Mr. Tevor Fox - representing the Surrey Film Council - Came before the Council and requested a grant of \$50.00 towards the work carried on by his organization.

A lengthy discussion ensued during which Mr. Fox stated that approximately 15 or 16 communities were now served by his organization and that the work carried out was mainly educational.

Moved by Councillor Shepherd

Seconded by Councillor Adams

That this matter be laid over for further consideration at the next meeting of the Council.

Mr. Lucien Cary - Came before the Council and enquired regarding possible purchase of a number of municipally owned lots in Section 36, Block 5N, Range 3W.

The matter was laid over for consideration at the next meeting of the Council.

Said By-law was read a third time.

Moved by Councillor Atchison

Seconded by Councillor Bishop

That "Lands Sale By-law, 1948, No. 930" be passed subject to reconsideration.

Carried

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

M. W. Shiles, Secretary, Cloverdale Branch, Canadian Legion - Re Mr. MacCaig's request for approximately 500 feet of road past Mr. Monkhouse's property.

The Clerk reported that he had contacted Mr. August Flink and that he was willing to convey the North 33 feet of his property to the Municipality to provide road access for Mr. MacCaig for the sum of \$250.00 with the understanding that the Municipality would install a fence along the road allowance adjoining his property and keep brush cut down.

Moved by Councillor Bishop

Seconded by Councillor McPherson

That purchase of the 33 feet for road allowance from Mr. Flink be authorized at a price of \$250.00.

Carried

H. E. Letchford - Drawing attention to dangerous condition of large tree on property adjoining his premises on Boundary Road.

Councillor Kuhn reported that he had investigated this matter and that

arrangements had been made by the B. C. Electric Railway Company to top the tree.

S. P. and F. J. McKinnon - Offering \$500.00 as purchase price of Lots 1 to 8, Block 7, Section 34, Block 5N, Range 2W, est of Pike Road.

Moved by Councillor McPherson

Seconded by Councillor Adams

That the offer be not accepted.

Carried

Nicholas Werbicki - Complained of drainage conditions affecting his property - Lot 27, Section 25, Block 5N, Range 2W, Map 625.

Councillor Bishop reported that he had been unable to look into the matter as yet and it was laid over pending investigation.

CORRESPONDENCE WAS READ AND DEALT WITH AS FOLLOWS:

Frank Jagerhofer - Offering \$1,000.00 as purchase price of timber on Blocks 4,5,17,19,23,44,47,48,49,50,78,111 and 112, Port Mann Townsite, Map 2546.

Mr. Jagerhofer appeared before the Council earlier in the meeting. The letter was ordered filed.

Mrs. Bertha L. F. Lester - Enclosing petition signed by residents on Brentwood Drive, requesting completion of said road before winter.

Referred to Councillor Bishop for attention.

Geo. S. Vickers - Requesting cleaning of ditch on the South side of Railway Avenue, Port Mann, which was silted in during the recent flood.

Referred to the Provincial Flood Damage Committee for attention.

R. J. Sheers - Enclosing petition signed by residents on Holley Road and Westminster Road requesting completion of Holley Road to Westminster Road and completion of Westminster Road through to Johnston Road.

Councillor Bishop reported that this matter had been attended to. The letter was ordered filed.

K. Grubert - Offering \$240.00 as purchase price of 8 municipally owned lots in Block 3, Section 36, Block 5N, Range 3W, Map 529A.

Mr. Grubert appeared before the Council earlier in the meeting. The letter was ordered filed.

G. Wilson and others - Requesting opening of Speen Road for a distance of 400 feet East from Tannery Road.

Referred to Councillor Shepherd and the Engineer for investigation and an estimate of cost.

A. G. Burrows - Reporting an accident to his truck on Townline Road 300 feet West of King George Highway allegedly caused by the side of the road caving in and claiming compensation in the amount of \$10.00 to cover expenses involved.

Referred to the Road Supervisor for attention. Clerk to deny Municipal responsibility for payment of account.

Mrs. Edna Adcock - Drawing attention to Beaubien Road and requesting that it be brushed out as soon as possible.

Councillor Johnston reported that this matter would be attended to.

Mrs. C. Wikene and others - Requesting that Cline Road west of King George Highway receive attention immediately.

Councillor Johnston reported that the works crew was working on this road at the present time and that Mr. Tom Reid, M.P., had undertaken to pay one half the cost of brushing this road adjoining his property.

Mrs. John Forsyth - Requesting opening of Burke Road east of King Street to furnish access to property recently purchased by her son, Gordon Forsyth, and property owned by Williams Brothers.

Councillor Johnston reported that he would investigate this matter during the ensuing week.

R. W. Scott - Submitting an offer of \$1,250.00 for Lots 12 & 13, SE $\frac{1}{4}$ Section 7, Tp. 2, Map 1577.

Laid over for further investigation.

J. F. Thom and others - Petition requesting that Stayte Road be ditched on the East side from the top of the hill on the South side of Oliver Road to a point 100 yards North of Oliver Road.

Ordered filed.

D. E. Jones - Requesting opening of Clow Road from Brown Road to provide access for his property Lot 5, S $\frac{1}{2}$ N $\frac{1}{2}$ NW $\frac{1}{4}$ Section 21, Tp. 1.

Referred to Councillor Adams.

S. A. Copp - Advising that the proposed bank protection work at Crescent is an issue effecting all residents of the area and expenditure should be borne by a general levy on the property owners.

P. Bain - Advising that he is willing to donate the sum of \$250.00 towards the cost of providing bank protection work at Crescent fronting his property.

Ordered filed. The question of bank protection work at Crescent was laid over for further consideration.

B. C. Electric Railway Co. Ltd. - Advising that 14 three hundred watt street lights burned for the first time in Crescent on June 21st and that the cost of these lights will be \$40.00 per year per lamp.

Ordered filed.

Crescent Beach Property Owners' Association - Requesting installation of 2 additional street lights at the corner of Beckett and Crescent Roads and at the corner of McBride and Sullivan Streets.

Moved by Councillor Adams

Seconded by Councillor Johnston

That the request of the Crescent Beach Property Owners' Association for installation of 2 additional street lights in the locations above-mentioned be approved and that the Clerk be instructed to make application to the B. C. Electric Railway Company Limited for installation of the said lights.

Carried

R. Garstang and others - With petition signed by residents and users of Johnston Road between King George Highway and Buena Vista Avenue requesting the Council to take immediate action towards rectifying the deplorable condition of this section of Johnston Road.

The Clerk was instructed to advise that negotiations with the Provincial Government to have this road re-built are still proceeding and the Council is hopeful that a definite commitment by the Provincial Government will be received in the near future.

Matthew T. Hill and others - Strongly protesting against the granting of a building permit for the conversion of the old Holy Trinity Church premises into an undertaking parlour.

Ordered filed.

Mrs. C. W. Grain - Advising that she had sustained a fall and injured her ankle, requiring medical treatment, on Martin Street between Victoria Avenue and Washington Avenue, allegedly caused by condition of the street and advising that her account for medical services will be forwarded to the Municipality for payment.

Clerk to deny responsibility for the accident.

The question of constructing the proposed sidewalk on this section of Martin Street was discussed and the Municipal Engineer was called in. It was decided to proceed with construction of this sidewalk without delay.

Municipal Engineer - Advising that the Engineer of the Great Northern Railway had intimated that construction of the culvert under their right-of-way between "A" and "B" Streets in White Rock would be undertaken in the very near future.

Councillor McPherson reported that the Railway Company had taken no action as yet to install this culvert and he suggested that the matter be taken up with the Railway Company again and immediate action be asked for.

The matter was referred to Councillor McPherson and the Engineer.

The question of using the municipal bulldozer was discussed and the Engineer drew attention to the number of subdivision roads which required attention.

No decision was reached on this matter.

C. W. Bradley - Further with reference to development of funeral parlour on Victoria Avenue and requesting the Council to close portion of "E" Street adjoining his property and granting him allease of that portion of the street he occupies at present.

Clerk to advise that the Council has no authority to give a lease to portion of a dedicated street.

F. O. Jones and others - Complaint re traffic hazard created by steep hill of Beach View Avenue to its dead end at Vidal Street.

Clerk to advise that the Council is contemplating some work on this street and that signs will be erected for the control of traffic as soon as possible.

C. S. Carr and others - Petition requesting Council and Police Commission to take steps to stop noise at White Rock.

A delegation in connection with this petition waited on the Council earlier in the meeting and the matter was thoroughly gone into at that time.

The Clerk was instructed to forward this petition to the Board of Police Commissioners and request that it receive immediate attention.

R.R.F. Sewell, Secretary, Union of B. C. Municipalities - Advising that the 45th Annual Convention of the Union of B. C. Municipalities to be held at Harrison Hot Springs Hotel on September 7th to 9th and that the Executive will meet on Monday, September 6th, at 3 p.m. Suggesting that applications for hotel reservations be made without delay.

The Clerk was instructed to reserve accommodation for seven members of the Council and four of their wives.

Geo. E. Jenkins - Applying for a quarry lease to obtain clay from the Peterson gravel pit or an option to purchase same.

Laid over for further consideration. Permission was given to bore test holes to test the quality of the material.

B. C. Motor Transportation Limited - Drawing attention to traffic situation existing in White Rock and Cloverdale and suggesting that the Council establish a bus zone on both sides of Washington Avenue adjacent to the bus depot and on both sides of the Pacific Highway in Cloverdale in front of their agency, the Shangri La Cafe.

Clerk to advise that the Council feels that the promised construction of bus depots off the highway in Cloverdale and White Rock is long overdue.

B. C. Electric Railway Company Limited - Advising of the difficulty of designing and producing a suitable mast-arm for street lights and enquiring if it would be permissible to locate some of the street lights on the opposite side of the street in order to obtain the necessary service from existing transformers.

Seconded by Councillor Adams

That the matter be referred to the Municipal Engineer and that he be empowered to use his own discretion in the matter of location of new street lights.

Carried

Secretary, Public Utilities Commission - Advising that it is the intention of the Commission that all outstanding rate questions of a general nature should be dealt with at public hearings and requesting that the Commission be advised of all matters which the Municipality wishes to have considered at the hearing and stating that if there are any other matters which the Municipality considers should be dealt with the Commission would be glad to receive suggestions.

Referred to the Public Utilities Committee of the Council and the Clerk.

Some discussion ensued and it was felt advisable to discuss this matter with the various Boards of Trade in the Municipality.

The Clerk was instructed to supply each member of the Council with a copy of this communication.

Canadian National Institute for the Blind - Requesting permission to hold a Tag Day in White Rock on August 7th and in Cloverdale during the first week of October in order to raise funds for that work.

Permission be granted Canadian National Institute for the Blind to hold a Tag Day in White Rock on August 7th and in Cloverdale on one day during the first week of October in order to raise funds for that organization.

Cancer Foundation - Giving details of funds received during the 1946 and 1947 Conquer Cancer Campaign drives and advising that at the end of the fiscal period June 30th, 1948, the operating deficit will amount to \$15,000.00. Also giving details of treatment provided for Surrey residents and other cases residing in the District during the years 1946 and 1947 and submitting that the cost involved justifies an appeal for further assistance and suggesting that in order to combat cancer the Council meet in full all expenses in connection with Surrey residents' cases as well as provide an annual grant in aid of other free

services given to residents of the District.
