BYLAW NO. 18079

A Bylaw to close and to remove the dedication  
of a highway of a portion of road

.....

WHEREAS pursuant to Subsection 40(1)(a) of the *Community Charter*, S.B.C. 2003, c. 26, the Council may, by bylaw, close all or part of a highway that is vested in the municipality to all or some types of traffic;

AND WHEREAS pursuant to Section 40(2) of the *Community Charter*, S.B.C. 2003, c. 26, the Council may, by bylaw, remove the dedication of a highway that has been closed by a bylaw under Subsection 40(1)(a).

NOW THEREFORE the Council of the City of Surrey, ENACTS as follows:

1. Those portions of Section 4, Township 7 New Westminster District dedicated as Road and shown outlined in heavy black line on Reference Plan EPP32502 attached hereto, prepared by Gary A. Rowbotham, BCLS, on the 17th day of October, 2013 and described as follows:

That portion of Road dedicated by Plan 15914 called Parcel A containing 0.187 hectares; and

That portion of Road dedicated by Plan 15914 called Parcel B containing 0.102 hectares; and

That portion of Road dedicated by Plan 9224 called Parcel C containing 0.134 hectares; and

(hereinafter referred to as that portion of Road)

shall be closed to traffic.

2. The dedication as highway be removed of said portion of Road.
3. This Bylaw may be cited for all purposes as "Surrey Close and Remove the Dedication of Highway of a Portion of Road Adjacent to 442 - 188 Street and 435 - 192 Street, Bylaw, 2013, No. 18079"




PASSED SECOND READING on the 12th day of November, 2013.
