SUBJECT: Community School Partnership Initiative

RECOMMENDATION

The Parks, Recreation and Culture Department recommend that Council receive this report as information.

BACKGROUND

The Community and Leisure Services division of the Parks, Recreation and Culture Department facilitates programs and initiatives in 58 of the 93 elementary schools and in five of the 26 public secondary schools in the City of Surrey (see Appendix 1). While these programs and initiatives are meeting the community needs in many of Surrey's neighbourhoods, it is still difficult for staff to secure space in some of the schools due to competing needs for limited space or expensive rental and janitorial fees when space is available but the schools are closed.

In June 2006, the City of Surrey and the Surrey School District #36 met to discuss the concept of a joint strategy beginning with the exploration of a community school-based partnership model. The Surrey School District allocated enough funding to this initiative to enable the hiring of 3 Community School Partnership Coordinators. It was determined that the 3 Community School Partnership Coordinators would oversee clusters of schools in three of the City of Surrey's 6 Town Centre areas. The beginning of this new partnership model will start in the three Town Centres with the most inner-city schools, namely, the Guildford Town Centre, Newton Town Centre and the Whalley Town Centre. For the first year of this initiative, the following schools were identified:

- 1. <u>Guildford Town Centre</u>: Guildford Park Secondary, Lena Shaw and Mary Jane Shannon Elementary Schools
- 2. Newton Town Centre: Strawberry Hills (with the highest percentage of non-English speaking schools in the district with 92 % of the students speaking Punjabi as their first language), W.E Kinvig and Cougar Creek Elementary Schools and Princess Margaret Secondary School.

3. Whalley Town Centre: K.B. Woodward and Kwantlen Park Secondary Schools and Bridgeview Elementary School.

The Community School Partnership initiative will operate throughout the school year and the summer.

The 3 Community School Partnership Coordinators are hired and will begin working March 19, 2007. The 3 Coordinators have a diverse range of experience making for an exciting and resourceful team. For example, one Coordinator is multi-lingual, speaking English, Punjabi and Hindi and will work in Newton Town Centre schools to effectively link resources with participants.

Program Purpose

The Community-Schools Partnership initiative links local services and resources to enhance programs in schools and create neighbourhood focal points for children, youth and families to make connections with city-wide services while building a sense of neighbourhood identity and promoting lifelong learning and community liveability. These Co-ordinators will work with the selected schools and neighbourhood representatives to develop specific partnership projects that fit with the overall Community School Partnership vision, building on strengths to meet local needs. Projects may focus on such themes as early childhood development, family involvement, parenting support, youth development/leadership initiatives, community-based learning, intercultural understanding, neighbourhood safety and community engagement. It is understood that each project will reflect the uniqueness and diversity of the local neighbourhood.

Vision

Through such partnerships, we will work to develop and support a community known for its thriving children and youth, healthy families, community-centred schools and safe neighbourhoods within a caring, vibrant, sustainable city.

Mission

We are committed to work together to build community through an alignment of resources, improved access to neighbourhood and city-wide services, forming innovative partnerships under a new spirit of collaboration and sense of vision amongst residents, agencies and businesses in Surrey.

Guiding Principles

- Inclusiveness The Community School Partnership's processes will strive to reflect the diversity of assets, needs and experiences by engaging and involving students, families, and community members in each participating neighbourhood.
- Relationships All participants involved in Community School Partnership will share the responsibility of building, modelling, and maintaining respectful and transparent relationships with other partners and stakeholders.

- Collaboration Through the Community School Partnership initiative, schools and community agencies work together as partners seeking value-added solutions and shared learning.
- Responsiveness The Community School Partnersip initiative is based upon an
 understanding that public institutions exist to serve the public and are obligated to
 develop programs and services that address continuously changing public needs and
 interests.
- Build upon strengths existing in schools and communities Community School
 Partnership initiative services and support are asset based, accessible and linked to or
 based in schools.
- Sharing of expertise and resources The Community School Partnership initiative seeks to use school and community physical, financial, and human resources to address student family and community needs.
- Self determination and local involvement The Community School Partnership initiative maintains that local people have a right and a responsibility to be involved in determining community needs and identifying resources that can be used to address those needs.
- Self-help and leadership development the Community School Partnership initiative recognizes that people are best served when their capacity to help themselves is acknowledged and developed. When people work together to assume responsibility for their own well-being, they build resilience, self reliance, inter-dependence and become part of the strength and solution.
- Sustainability Through strategic collaboration, alignment of resources and a focus on do-able, community responsive projects and activities that add to the integration of services at a neighbourhood level, the Community School Partnership initiative seeks to achieve sustainability.
- Child and Youth voices and involvement, children and youth will have input into what their needs and interests are in their community and schools and will work with the partners and staff to develop programs, services, volunteer and mentorship opportunities for children and youth.

The Community Schools Partnership Committee

Mandate

The Community Schools Partnership Committee, co-chaired by senior representatives from the School Board and the City of Surrey's Parks, Recreation and Culture Department:

- Is the holder of the collective Community Schools Partnership vision; and
- Provides oversight leadership, strategic direction and support to facilitate the ongoing development, implementation and accountability of the initiatives.

Key Functions

- Ensuring that the implementation of the Community School Partnership initiatives at the city-wide hub and school levels is synchronized with the overall Vision, Mission and Guiding Principles;
- Promoting the Community School Partnership Initiative as an innovative approach to community building;
- Building relationships and communicating with existing and potential Community School Partnership partners and stakeholders;
- Monitoring changes in public policy and funding mechanisms that have implications for the work of the Community School Partnership initiative at the city wide hub and school levels;
- Identifying opportunities that will move forward the Community School Partnership Vision;
- Providing advice and direction to the Community School Partnership Co-ordinator team;
- Problem solving and removing systemic barriers that are identified as a result of the work and activities at the local school and hub levels;
- Developing new inter-agency protocols as required to facilitate the Community School Partnership work;
- Ensuring a coherent and collaborative approach to resource and development to avoid unhealthy competition for resources amongst local agencies;
- Developing and implementing an overall evaluation framework; and
- Monitoring, celebrating and communicating the outcomes of the Community School Partnership initiatives.

Term

The Community School Partnership initiative is being developed as a long-term innovative approach to building the capacity of the community to meet the needs of the children, youth, families and other residents of Surrey. The first three years will focus on inner-city needs in Guildford, Whalley and Newton with the intention of evolving into a city—wide model.

Structure of Committee

Membership of approximately 12 to 16 including:

- 3 School District representatives designated by the Superintendents Office;
- 3 City representatives, from the Parks, Recreation and Culture Department, Planning and Development and Surrey Libraries; and
- representation from the following organizations or coalitions:
 - United Way
 - Ministry of Children and Family Development
 - Fraser Health
 - Surrey RCMP
 - Surrey Children and Youth Committee
 - Surrey Children's Collaborative
 - Surrey/White Rock Make Children First
 - Surrey Middle Years Matters
 - Vibrant Surrey
 - Surrey Board of Trade (potential addition)

Chair

The Committee will be co-chaired by representatives from the School District and the City of Surrey – Parks, Recreation and Culture Department.

The Community School Partnership Committee co-chairs are responsible for inviting potential members to join the committee and to appoint a new representative if a member is not able to regularly contribute to the committee.

Sub-committee/Working groups:

The Committee may from time to time decide to strike sub-committees and/or working groups to examine a particular issue in more detail. The scope, membership and term will be defined as required.

Parks Recreation and Culture will continue to offer programs in schools under this new partnership by providing programming before school, afterschool and in the evenings. Parks Recreation and Culture will continue to hire and pay staff and maintain the school registrations and collect the revenues. Parks Recreation and Culture offers value programs in schools and works in partnerships with agencies to provide some free programs and services and receives

grants to work in schools with other partners. In addition, Parks, Recreation and Culture also offers the Leisure Access Program to Surrey School District #36 students who participate in City programs in the schools. With this new expanded partnership, Parks Recreation and Culture along with RCMP and Safe Schools will be able to expand their programs and services into the evenings, weekends and summers without having to pay expensive rental fees.

CONCLUSION

The Surrey School District and the City of Surrey representatives from Libraries, Planning and Parks, Recreation and Culture Departments are extremely excited to participate as co-partners in this important initiative to create healthy and engaged children, youth, families and communities in the City of Surrey. This is the beginning of a vision that will continue to grow, expand and evolve to include all town centres in all 121 schools within British Columbia's largest School District.
