SUBJECT: Update on Preparations for the 2012 BC Summer Games

RECOMMENDATION

The Parks and Recreation and Culture Department recommends that Council receive this report as information.

INTENT

The purpose of this report is to provide information about the status of preparations in relation to the City hosting the 2012 BC Summer Games, which are to take place between July 19th and July 22nd, 2012.

BACKGROUND

The BC Summer Games is a multi-sport event held every 2 years. The 2012 event is expected to involve approximately 3,000 athletes, 600 coaches and 375 officials. In addition, approximately 4,000 volunteers will be involved in staging the Games. The City of Surrey was selected to host the 2012 Summer Games through a competitive bid process.

DISCUSSION

Board of Directors

During the spring of 2011, an independent Society was formed for the purpose of overseeing the preparations for the Surrey Summer Games and a Board of Directors was endorsed by Council. The Board is headed by President, Mr. Bill McNamara and Co- Chair, Councillor Linda Hepner. There are 14 Directors on the Board including Councillor Bruce Hayne who is responsible for the portfolio titled "Friends of the Games". Corporate Report No. R227;2011, attached as Appendix 1 to this report, lists the Directors on the Board and the sub-Committee for which each Director is responsible.

Games Office & Staff

A 2012 BC Summer Games office has been established at 7452 – 132 Street, having been opened in January 2012. The office accommodates the Operations Manager for the Games (Diana Klingner) and other administrative staff and will also serve as the Volunteer Headquarters for the Games.

Friends of the Games

The Friends of the Games (FOG) is the title of the fund-raising effort for the 2012 Games. It has been very successful to date in raising funds and in-kind contributions with further efforts in this regard continuing. Coast Capital Savings has agreed to be a major Corporate Partner for the Games.

Promotions

The City of Surrey Marketing Section is working closely with the BC Games Promotions Directorate in developing a Marketing Plan for the Games. The Marketing Plan will include the use of:

- Social media via the City website, Twitter, and Facebook pages;
- Electronic Billboards;
- Transit Shelter posters;
- Street banners:
- Posters in Community Recreation Facilities; and
- Interactive displays at all major City events including Party for the Planet and Canada Day.

The Plan will also include a media and communications strategy for implementation during the Games to maximize the exposure that the City achieves through the Games.

Games Awareness Event - Guildford Town Centre

On Saturday, February 18^{th,} 2012, the Surrey Games Board of Directors held a community awareness event at Guildford Town Centre, which was focused on raising awareness related to volunteer opportunities associated with the Games. That event resulted in a noticeable increase in volunteer registrations on the BC Games website. The event also resulted in local media print and web stories regarding the upcoming Games.

2012 Vernon BC Winter Games

The Games Board of Directors and a couple of City staff attended the BC Winter Games that were held in Vernon from February 23rd to 26th, 2012. The Board and staff were able to observe first-hand the organization that was involved in the running of that event. Staff met with their counterparts in Vernon to discuss issues and opportunities associated with the Games. Staff of the City of Vernon was very open in discussing the challenges or issues that they faced in preparing for the Games.

Torch Lighting Ceremony/100 day Countdown - Bear Creek Park - April 19th, 2012

The Ceremonies Directorate is planning a Torch Lighting Ceremony that will include a torch relay around the Bear Creek Park track. A reception for invited guests will follow the ceremony, which will be held in the Studio Theatre at the Surrey Art Centre.

Accreditation Centre

The Accreditation Centre will be located at the Cloverdale Arena. The Registration & Results Directorate is responsible for planning and implementing the Accreditation Centre. The Centre is the first stop for athletes who are participating in the Summer Games. The athletes register at this Centre and are then transported to their accommodations.

Opening Ceremonies - Holland Park - July 19th

The Ceremonies Directorate is busy planning the Opening Ceremonies that will take place at Holland Park on Thursday, July 19, 2012. The Opening Ceremonies are a highlight of the Games. Athletes from all eight regions of the Province will march into Holland Park to open the Games. The Opening Ceremonies will use infrastructure that will be in place for the Fusion Festival that will be taking place in Holland Park on July 21st and 22nd, 2012. The Opening Ceremonies will include youth dance teams, such as Bhangra dancers, and presentations by other cultural groups.

Provincial Government Reception - July 19th

Immediately following the Opening Ceremonies at Holland Park, there will be Provincial Government reception hosted by the BC Summer Games Society that will include representation from the Province, City Council and those that are sponsors of the Games.

Civic Luncheon – July 20th

A civic luncheon event at the Sheraton Guildford Hotel is being planned for the second day of the Games to honour the City's commitment to the Games.

Participating Sports & Venues

The Games will involve 20 different sports. The venues for each of these sports have been booked to accommodate the competitions. The Provincial sport organizations responsible for each of the various sports toured the facilities on Saturday, November 5, 2011 to confirm that each such venue was appropriate for the related competition. A second venue tour has been scheduled for April 14th and 15th, 2012. This second tour is a final opportunity for the Provincial Sport Associations to provide input.

Food Services

The Coverall Building at the Cloverdale Fairgrounds will be the main dining area for athletes and coaches during the Games. Additional tents will be set up on the Fairgrounds to expand the seating area to accommodate the number of people that will need to be fed. A kitchen area will be established in the covered area behind the Agriplex. Box lunches will be packaged at Lord Tweedsmuir Secondary School and will be transported to each of the sport venues for certain meals during the Games.

In advance of the Opening Ceremonies, participants will be provided with dinner at Holland Park. Food Services is working closely with the Fraser Health Authority to ensure health standards are fully satisfied with respect to in all aspects of food service during the Games.

Transportation

Transportation for the Games is a complex task given the geographical separation of the various venues for Games events. Planning for this element of the Games is well underway by the Transportation Directorate.

Accommodation

Fourteen (14) schools have been identified for use as dormitories by athletes, coaches and officials involved in the Games. These schools are listed in Appendix 2 of this report.

Special Events

The Special Events Directorate has identified the Newton Recreation Complex as the location for the holding of two dances that are being organized for the athletes during the Games. The North Surrey Recreation Centre has been identified as the location where athletes and coaches will muster at the conclusion of the Games to meet and socialize and will allow the athletes and coaches to attend the Fusion Festival, which will be taking place at Holland Park at the same time.

SUSTAINABILITY CONSIDERATIONS

The hosting of the 2012 BC Summer Games will assist in achieving the goals of the City's Sustainability Charter; more particularly the following:

- SC 6 "Providing support for local service organizations, whether government or the non-profit sector for actions that are within the City's mandated responsibilities";
- SC 12 "Encouraging and facilitating volunteerism and participation in community activities by persons of all ages, abilities, and cultural communities."; and
- SC13 "Promoting a variety of opportunities for community celebration and gathering through local and city-wide events and festivals..."

CONCLUSION

The BC Summer Games is one of the City's largest community engagement opportunities in the 2012 calendar. This event will build community pride and capacity in alignment with the City's "Ahead of the Game" Sport Tourism Strategy. By hosting the 2012 BC Summer Games the City will be in a better position to bid on larger multi-sport games in the future. Planning for hosting the 2012 BC Summer Games is well underway. The City, in association with the 2012 BC Summer Games Society, is working closely with the Surrey School District and other community and corporate partners to deliver the most successful BC Summer Games to date!

SUBJECT: Surrey 2012 BC Summer Games - Update

RECOMMENDATION

The Parks and Recreation and Culture Department recommends that Council receive this report as information.

INTENT

The purpose of this report is to provide an update on the 2012 BC Summer Games which will take place from July 19th through July 22nd, 2012.

BACKGROUND

In February 2009, Council endorsed a bid by the City to host either the 2012 or 2014 BC Summer Games (see Appendix 1 - CR R020 Amendment to Application to Host the BC Summer Games). The City of Surrey was selected to host the 2012 Games.

The BC Summer Games are held every two years. With a 33 year history, more than 40 communities have hosted either the BC Summer Games or the BC Winter Games. The economic impact of the Summer Games based on direct spending by participants, spectators and volunteers is over \$2 million (\$2.2M in Nanaimo – 2002 Games; \$2.6M in Kelowna – 2008 Games). Most recently, the Township of Langley hosted the BC Summer Games in 2010.

The BC Games provides a vital stepping stone in the development of the best young athletes in the Province. As host of the 2012 Games, Surrey will gain additional sport hosting experience while showcasing our city and our recreation facilities to the rest of the Province.

The Summer Games are a multi-sport event that will involve approximately 3,000 athletes, 600 coaches and 375 officials. In addition, as many as 4,000 volunteers will be required to stage the Games.

DISCUSSION

Board of Directors

The BC Summer Games Society requires that a local Society be established including a Board of Directors to oversee the process of preparing for and staging the Games and undertaking appropriate follow-up actions after the Games are completed. During the spring of 2011, an independent Society was formed for the Surrey Summer Games and a Board of Directors was endorsed by Council. The Board includes as President, Mr. Bill McNamara and as Co- Chair, Councillor Linda Hepner. There are 14 Directors on the Board. The name of each of the Directors on the Board along with a listing of the Chairs of sub-committees that fall under the portfolio responsibility of each of the Directors are listed in Appendix 2 attached to this report.

Games Office & Staff

A Games office is being set up at 7452 - 132 Street, which will be operational on January 15^{th} , 2012. The office space will accommodate the Operations Manager and administrative staff and will also be the volunteer headquarters for the Games.

Ms. Diana Klingner has been recruited by the Board as the Operations Manager. City staff are maintaining on-going liaison with the Board of Directors and the Operations Manager to assist in ensuring that the Games are a success.

Logo & Branding

The Society Board Director responsible for Games Promotions has formed a committee to develop a logo and brand associated with Surrey's 2012 Summer Games. This committee worked with the City's Marketing Section to come up with a logo that connected with the City's branding and expressed a summer look and feel in keeping with the season of the Games. The Board-approved logo design is attached as Appendix 3.

The logo is reflective of the eight geographic zones within the Province from which send participants to the Games. The logo is intended to convey a youthful and playful feel while communicating the diversity of both Surrey and the games participants. It incorporates a subtle connection to both Surrey's iconic logo symbol and visual identity while making a connection to the Games torch. Finally, the vibrant colours reflect summer and capture the inspiration and achievement of the Games experience. The abstract design introduces a contemporary and modern look that is consistent with Surrey's progressive and forward thinking vision.

The tagline "We're Game" speaks both to the community's spirit for hosting the Games as well as the motivational spirit of athletes to excel at their sport and follow their dreams.

Participating Sports & Venues

The Games will involve 20 different sports as listed in Appendix 4. Appropriate sport venues have been identified and booked to accommodate the competitions. The Provincial sport

organizations responsible for each of the various sports toured the facilities on Saturday, November 5, 2011 to confirm their adequacy.

The Parks Division will ensure that all outdoor sport venues are prepared and ready to host the Games. This includes capital improvements to the Bear Creek Park track as well as the addition of two sand volleyball courts at South Surrey Athletic Park.

Key Dates

The following are some key dates in relation to preparing for and hosting the Games:

November 23/11: BC Summer Games Volunteer Kickoff reception – Council Chambers and

Civic Street, City Hall

January 2012: Office Opening - 7452 - 132 Street

Mid February 2012: Games Awareness Event - Guildford Town Centre

100 days out: Torchlighting Ceremony

July 19: Opening Ceremonies - Holland Park, VIP reception to follow at SFU Surrey

July 20 – 22: Games competitions

July 22: Closing Ceremonies - Holland Park

Games Legacy

The Surrey BC Summer Games will increase community pride and civic spirit. The Games will enhance the skills of the large number of volunteers who will be involved in the event. The experience of hosting a successful multi-sport games agenda will position Surrey to bid on, and attract larger games to our City. The Games will also serve to promote a healthy, active lifestyle.

The Games will also leave a financial legacy consisting of 50% of excess revenue after expenses that will remain in Surrey for a sports legacy to be determined by the 2012 BC Summer Games Board of Directors and the City.

Another legacy resulting from the Games are the infrastructure improvements that remain after the Games for the use and enjoyment of local amateur sport and recreations groups.

SUSTAINABILITY CONSIDERATIONS

The 2012 BC Summer Games will assist in achieving a variety of the goals contained in the City's Sustainability Charter as follows:

 SC 6 – "Providing support for local service organizations, whether government or the non-profit sector for actions that are within the City's mandated responsibilities"

- SC 12 "Encouraging and facilitating volunteerism and participation in community activities by persons of all ages, abilities, and cultural communities."
- SC13 "Promoting a variety of opportunities for community celebration and gathering through local and city-wide events and festivals..."
- SC14 "Implementing Healthy eating and food and beverage practices at City facilities."; and
- EN14 "The City will provide information on best practices in areas such as
 alternative energy systems, energy efficiency, recycling and re-use, composting and
 reduction of solid and liquid waste through a variety of communication means that
 are easily accessible to local residents and businesses."

CONCLUSION

Planning and organizing the Surrey 2012 BC Summer Games is well underway. The Board of Directors for the BC Games Society is comprised of community leaders including representation from City Council. Hosting the BC Games is a natural fit for the City of Surrey as Surrey boasts some of the best parks and recreation facilities in the Province. With a large population of children and youth in Surrey, the Games will highlight the value of sport and social development to the City's youth. Many athletes who have participated in previous BC Games have gone onto higher levels of competition including the Pan-Am Games, the Commonwealth Games and the Olympics. The 2012 BC Summer Games Society in association with the City of Surrey is fully committed to delivering the most successful BC Summer Games ever!

SUBJECT: Amendment to Application to Host the BC Summer Games

RECOMMENDATION

The Parks, Recreation and Culture Department recommends that Council approve an amendment to the City of Surrey application to the B.C. Games Society (the "Society") to indicate that the City of Surrey is prepared to host the BC Summer Games (the "Games") in either of 2012 or 2014 based on the same conditions as were included in the previous application by the City to the Society.

BACKGROUND

In September 2008, Council considered Corporate Report R188 (copy attached as Appendix 1) and adopted the recommendations of that report, which was to approve the submission of an application to the Society to host the BC Summer Games in 2014. The report advised that hosting the Games in 2014 trather than in 2012 was preferable as there may be a greater pool of volunteers available in 2014 than in 2012, given that the 2010 Olympic and Paralympic Games may absorb an amount of Surrey-based volunteer capacity that will take some time to replenish. The Society has advised that depending on the applications that they received, it would be advantageous if Surrey would consider expanding their application to allow the City to host either the 2012 or 2014 Games.

The City of Surrey has also submitted a proposal to host the BC Disability Games in 2013, which was endorsed by the Parks & Community Services Committee and approved by City Council. The BC Disability Games Society Board, in a letter dated January $6^{th}, 2009,$ advised that they are withdrawing their request for proposals at this time and will initiate another process for proposals in the future in respect to hosting the BC Disability Games.

DISCUSSION

As noted in Corporate Report R188, the B.C. Summer Games attracts about 3,600 participants and is held over a 4-day period, typically during July. The host community for the Games typically experiences a significant economic benefit due to the athletes and visitors that come to the host city prior to and during the Games. This benefit is estimated to be in the range of \$2 million to \$3 million.

The City of Surrey has the capacity to support the Summer Games in either of 2012 or 2014 with an excellent range of venues and sufficient volunteers. Some of the venues that will be used for the Games are owned and operated by the Surrey School District. As such, if Council approves the recommendation of this report, it will also be necessary to obtain an amended resolution from the Board of School District #36, indicating its willingness to make available the necessary School District venues for the 2012 Games.

CONCLUSION

Based on the above discussion, it is recommended that Council approve an amendment to the City of Surrey application to the B.C. Games Society (the "Society") to indicate that the City of Surrey is prepared to host the BC Summer Games (the "Games") in either of 2012 or 2014 based on the same conditions as were included in the previous application to the Society.

SUBJECT: Invitation to Host the BC Summer Games

RECOMMENDATION

The Parks, Recreation and Culture Department recommends that Council:

- Approve the submission of an application to the B.C. Games Society for the City of Surrey to host the BC Summer Games (the "Games") in 2014; and
- 2. Approve the inclusion in the application, as required by the B.C. Games Society, of:
 - a. a commitment of \$45,000 for general expenses plus \$50,000 of in-kind services and facilities toward hosting the Games; and
 - b. a commitment of \$45,000 for a full time Games Operations Manager to be employed by the City for a 9-month period in advance of and during the Games.

BACKGROUND

In August, the City of Surrey received a letter from the BC Games Society inviting Surrey to apply to host the BC Summer Games or B.C. Winter Games in either 2012 or 2014. These Games are held every two years.

With the Surrey-based volunteer time that will be absorbed by the Olympic and Paralympic Games being hosted in Vancouver in 2010, staff holds the view that there will be a greater pool of volunteers available for the 2014 Summer Games than in 2012. The Games in 2014 are scheduled for July 17th to July 20th. The deadline for bid submission is December 15, 2008.

A report on the invitation to host the B.C. Games was considered by the Parks and Community Services Committee at its meeting on September 17th, 2008 meeting at which time the Committee resolved to recommend to City Council that Surrey apply to host the 2014 B.C. Summer Games with funding commitments as noted in the recommendation section of this report. 281

As an aside, the City of Surrey has already submitted a bid to host the BC Disability Games in 2013 (deadline September 30, 2008), which was endorsed by the Parks & Community Services Committee and approved by City Council. The decision on the BC Disability Games will be made, by the organizing Society in the late fall of this year.

DISCUSSION

The B.C. Games were initiated by the Government of BC in 1978. Since that time, the BC Games have played an important part in the development of amateur sport and athletes as well as communities in British Columbia. The purpose of the B.C. Games is to:

- assist in developing B.C. athletes, coaches, and officials in preparation for higher levels
 of competition;
- promote interest and participation in athletic and sports activities by the citizens of B.C.;
- assist in the development of strong and vibrant communities in the Province.

The Government of BC, through the Ministry of Healthy Living and Sport, will provide \$600,000 for the administration and operation of the 2014 BC Summer Games. As part of the application process, the prospective hosting community is required to commit resources to the BC Games. A minimum of \$45,000 cash and \$50,000 of in-kind services and facilities is required for the planning and staging of the Summer Games. In addition, the Host Community must employ a full-time Operations Manager for approximately 9 months in advance of and during the Games to ensure that the Games are properly planned and managed. It is estimated that such a position would cost approximately \$45,000 for the 9-month period. Planning for the BC Summer Games typically begins about 2 years prior to the Games.

Typically, the B.C. Summer Games attracts about 3,600 participants and is held over a 4-day period. One of the benefits to the host community is the significant economic impact that is created by the athletes and visitors that come to the host city immediately prior to and during the Games. This economic impact is estimated to be in the range of \$2 million to \$3 million.

Surrey hosted the BC Summer Games in 1989. These games were very successful in raising awareness of the abilities of BC athletes and showcasing the City of Surrey as a sport tourism destination. The City has the capacity to support the Summer Games through an excellent range of venues, some of which are located in School District facilities. A resolution will be required from the Board of School District #36, indicating support for the bid application and willingness to donate the necessary School District facilities during the Games.

The City of Surrey has the capacity to recruit the necessary number of volunteers to ensure a successful Summer Games through our full time volunteer coordinator and central volunteer registry, which contains the names of hundreds of willing volunteers.

CONCLUSION

Based on the above discussion, it is recommended that Council:

- Approve the submission of an application to the B.C. Games Society for the City of Surrey to host the BC Summer Games (the "Games") in 2014; and
- o Approve the inclusion in the application, as required by the B.C. Games Society, of:
 o a commitment of \$45,000 for general expenses plus \$50,000 of in-kind services and facilities toward hosting the Games; and
 o a commitment of \$45,000 for a full time Games Operations Manager to be employed by the City for a 9-month period in advance of and during the Games.
