SUBJECT: Service Above Self Surrey Youth (SASSY) Awards 2014

RECOMMENDATION

The Parks, Recreation and Culture Department and the Finance and Technology Department recommend that the Finance Committee recommend that Council approve funding in the amount of \$7,500 from the Council Initiatives Fund to support the upcoming 2014 Service Above Self Surrey Youth (SASSY) Awards as generally described in this report.

INTENT

The purpose of this report is to provide background information about the Sassy Awards initiative and to seek approval for funding from the Council Initiatives Fund in the amount of \$7,500 to support the upcoming 2014 SASSY Awards.

BACKGROUND

The City of Surrey partnered with the Semiahmoo Rotary Club, Surrey School District - Ideas36, Kwantlen Polytechnic University, White Rock Rotary Club and Central City Rotary Club to host the 3rd annual SASSY Awards on November 1, 2013 at the Bell Centre honouring youth who are living in Surrey or White Rock and are making a difference in our community by demonstrating the Rotary ideal of "Service Above Self". Youth (aged 16-21) were recognized for their achievement in 6 categories and all nominees were acknowledged at the event for their hard work and dedication to their community.

The City of Surrey declared November 1, 2013 Rotary "Service Above Self Surrey Youth Awards Day" in Surrey. In continuing the efforts to support and recognize Surrey's amazing young people, the 4th annual SASSY Awards will be held this year at the Surrey Arts Centre on November 21, 2014.

DISCUSSION

At the 2014 SASSY Awards, seven awards will be presented to youth in the categories of:

- Against-the-Odds;
- Environmental Leadership;
- Athletic and Sportsmanship;

- Performing and Visual Arts;
- Community Service;
- Youth Leadership; and
- Humanitarian Leadership.

Each award recipient receives a \$1,000 bursary, as well as \$500 to donate to a registered charity of their choice and a stylized SASSY Award trophy.

All award nominees will have a chance to win the trip of a lifetime courtesy of White Rock Travel and G Adventures.

Proceeds from the SASSY Awards go toward youth related projects by local Interact and Rotary Clubs, furthering the theme of "Youth helping Youth".

The SASSY Award partners and Corporate Sponsorship contributions cover the cost of promoting the Awards and producing the Award event and bursaries.
