SUBJECT: Afro-Canadian Positive Network of BC - Funding Request

RECOMMENDATION

The Finance and Technology Department recommends that the Finance Committee recommend that Council approve financial support in the amount of \$5,000 from Council Initiatives Fund to the Afro-Canadian Positive Network of BC to support the delivery of their HIV education and awareness program for refugees and immigrants.

INTENT

The City has received a request from the Afro-Canadian Positive Network of BC (ACPNET-BC) for financial assistance to support the delivery of their HIV education and awareness program for refugees and immigrants. This report addresses that request.

DISCUSSION

ACPNET-BC seeks to alleviate the effects of HIV/AIDS amongst refugees, immigrants, and all Afro Canadians infected and affected by HIV/AIDS. The network is made up of families and individuals and is run by members, providing services for HIV/AIDS education, immigration, interpretation, translation, resettlement, familiarization, family care, counseling, cultural foods and recreational activities. ACPNET-BC collaborates with other HIV services in BC and encourages members in belonging to multiple organizations. The City has received a request from ACPNET-BC for financial assistance to support the delivery of their HIV education and awareness program for refugees and immigrants.

Staff has reviewed this request and found that it does not meet the City Grant Policy as it is for operating funds, however should Council choose to support this organization, staff would recommend that support in the amount of \$5,000 be granted from the Council Initiatives Fund.

CONCLUSION

Based on the above discussion, it is recommended that the Finance Committee recommend that Council approve financial support in the amount of \$5,000 from Council Initiatives Fund to the Afro-Canadian Positive Network of BC to support the delivery of their HIV education and awareness program for refugees and immigrants.
