Sanitary Pump Station Improvements at Four Stations

RECOMMENDATIONS

The Engineering Department recommends that Council:

- 1. Award Contract M.S. 4715-060-11 to Merletti Construction (1999) Ltd. in the amount of \$627,060.00, including GST, for improvements at Quibble Creek, Burkhardt, Stewart Farm, and Douglas sanitary pump stations; and
- 2. Set the expenditure authorization limit for Contract M.S. 4715-060-11 at \$690,000.00, including GST and contingency.

SCOPE OF WORK

The construction package related to this contract consists of installing standby generators at four sanitary pump stations and plug valve replacement at one pump station, as listed in the following table, which are also illustrated on the map attached to this report as Appendix I. The works being constructed will provide reliability and assurance that the station will remain operational during electrical power outages.

The contract work is expected to start on December 7, 2015, with a 4-month delivery period for the generators. Construction will commence in April/May of 2016 and be completed by July, 2016.

The Engineer's (Omni Engineering Inc.) pre-tender estimate was \$732,900.00, including GST.

EVALUATION

The City's consultant reviewed the tender submissions for accuracy and completeness. No errors were found. All submissions included the required 10% bid bond, were signed and sealed on the Tender Form, and were initialed on the Summary Sheet of the Schedule of Quantities and Prices.

The low bidder, Merletti Construction (1999) Ltd., has provided a Consent of Surety for a Performance Bond and a Labour & Materials Bond, and agreed to complete the work within 120 working days, as stipulated in the contract. Merletti Construction (1999) Ltd.'s past performance on similar work has been satisfactory. They have no outstanding legal claims against the City. It is recommended that Merletti Construction (1999) Ltd. be awarded Contract M.S. 4715-060-11.

SUSTAINABILITY CONSIDERATIONS

The work associated with this contract will assist in achieving the objectives of the City's Sustainability Charter. In particular, the project supports the following scope actions:

- EC3: Sustainable Infrastructure Maintenance and Replacement; and
- EN8: Sustainable Engineering Standards and Practice.


FUNDING
