SUBJECT: Community Enhancement Partnership (CEP) Program – Facade Enhancement

Grant Applications – Ukrainian Orthodox Cultural Centre

RECOMMENDATION

The Parks, Recreation & Culture Department and the Finance & Technology Department, recommend that Council approve a grant under the CEP program of up to \$3,000 to the Ukrainian Orthodox Cultural Centre in City Centre.

BACKGROUND

In January 2010 Council adopted the Community Enhancement Partnership (CEP) Program, which is intended to provide financial support for projects focused on community engagement and neighbourhood beautification. Under the CEP Program, residents and community groups may apply to the City for a grant under either of two separate categories: Small Project Grants and Celebration and Activity Grants. In 2013, a third category called Facade Enhancement Grants was adopted by Council. The Facade Enhancement grants enable small businesses or commercial property owners to apply for funding to renovate or improve their building facades. These grants provide an incentive to conduct building improvements that make streets a more interesting and appealing environment, and attract people and businesses to the area.

The Facade Enhancement Grant Guidelines are attached as Appendix "I".

The community has been notified of this Facade program through Business Improvement Association member mail-outs, the City's website and at community association meetings. A Grant Selections Committee has been established with representatives from various departments and is responsible for assessing grant applications that are received under the Program.

The following sections of this report provide a description and evaluation of an application for a Facade Enhancement grant under the CEP Program that was recently received by the City.

DISCUSSION

<u>Ukrainian Orthodox Cultural Centre Façade Grant</u>

The Ukrainian Orthodox Cultural Centre has applied for a Facade Enhancement Grant of \$3,000 to support the addition of a wrought iron fence at 13512 - 108 Avenue (Appendix "II"). This project includes the addition of a 6' high decorative fence along the sidewalk with vehicle access gates along 108 Avenue as well as along the property frontage along 135A Street.

The new fence will help to secure the property and reduce the instance of nuisance behaviour affecting visitors and staff. The fence, along with landscape improvements will help to better define the property boundaries, while matching the new fencing around the Ukrainian Orthodox Church. Organizers anticipate that the improved security will encourage more groups to use the cultural hall, bringing more pedestrian traffic and vibrancy to this area of City Centre.

The project costs include \$3,000 to be applied to the \$17,000 overall fencing costs. Based on a review of the project against the Facade Enhancement Grant criteria, a grant of up to \$3,000 (30 percent of the costs) to the Ukrainian Orthodox Cultural Centre is considered reasonable, subject to the following conditions:

- The submission of receipts for fencing installation; and
- The submission to the City of photographs that act to document the progress and outcomes of the project.

Appendix "III" provides information on the status of funding related to the Facade Enhancement Program based on an assumption that Council will approve the recommendations of this report.

SUSTAINABILITY CONSIDERATIONS

The CEPP Program supports the goals of the City's Sustainability Charter by encouraging social connections, volunteerism, community ownership and citizen engagement, in accordance with the Sustainability Charter Goals SC 6, 7, 8 and 13.

CONCLUSION

Based on the above discussion, it is recommended that Council approve a grant under the (CEP) Facade Enhancement Program of up to \$3,000 to the Ukrainian Orthodox Cultural Centre to support a fencing project at 13512 - 108 Avenue.

CEPP Program Overview and Guidelines

Community Enhancement Partnership Program (CEPP) Program Overview and Guidelines Facade Enhancement Grant

The City of Surrey's Facade Enhancement Program encourages commercial property owners to invest in their buildings through façade renovations. Property owners are urged to renovate, building façades through grants, matching up to 30% of the eligible costs to a maximum of \$3,000. Through the Facade Enhancement Program, property owners will help to improve the streetscape of the local community, attracting residents, businesses and customers to the area.

PROGRAM GOALS

The program addresses the following objectives:

- 1. Make city streets a more inviting and interesting place to walk and shop;
- 2. Build civic pride within the local business community;
- 3. Contribute to the quality of life of residents, workers and visitors in Surrey; and
- 4. Promote the marketability of local business areas

GRANT ALLOCATION

The program can provide grants of up to 30% of the cost of eligible improvements, to a maximum of \$3,000 per building. Any fees required for City permits can be included in addition to the grant. Program participants are eligible for reimbursement upon the completion of their approved project. Applications will be reviewed on an ongoing basis. Applicants are encouraged to apply at any time.

Council approval for the Facade Enhancement Grant must be given prior to any work being performed. Grants will not be awarded to Facade Enhancement projects that are under construction or completed.

Facade and storefront Enhancement proposals will be:

- Reviewed on a case by case basis
- Subject to approval by the Project Review Committee
- Subject to a legal agreement between the property owner and the City of Surrey
- Subject to the availability of funding

Eligible Applicants

- The applicant must be a property owner. If the applicant is the business owner/tenant, the applicant must have the approval of the property owner in writing
- Applicant must be current on all property tax obligations
- Business owners must have a valid Surrey Business License

DESIGN GUIDELINES

Facade renovations must involve the general upgrading of a building's external appearance focusing on the following guidelines:

- Contribute to the pedestrian environment by improving the aesthetic impact of the facade by adding visual interest to the streetscape;
- Provide year-round impact and permanent impact;
- Be completed in ways that are compatible with the original design of the structure;
- Contribute to the building's character; and
- Encourage other restoration or redevelopment within the downtown area.

Eligible Enhancements

Facade is defined as the portion of a building that faces the public right-of-way and is fronted by a sidewalk or similar pedestrian-oriented pathway. Facade enhancements restore or redesign existing storefronts. Renovations should improve the interface between the public right-of-way and commercial spaces, and enhance the overall streetscape.

All facade Enhancements should be compatible with applicable zoning codes, satisfy permit requirements, and conform to any other regulatory restrictions.

Eligible facade Enhancements include:

- Restoration of exterior finishes and/or repainting of exterior facades;
- Repair and/or replacement of frontage windows and doors;
- Exterior lighting;
- Repair and/or replacement of signs and other fixtures;
- Installation and/or repair of awnings;
- Addition of patio areas and/or permanent landscaping elements; and
- Removal of barriers to access for people with disabilities and mobility challenges.
- Repair or restoration of facade masonry, brickwork, or wood
- Enhancement & removal of safety grilles

REIMBURSEMENT

- Funded projects must be completed within one year of Council approval, unless
 otherwise authorized by City staff. If the project is not completed by the deadline, the
 City's obligation to reimburse the owner or tenant for the project is terminated and
 funds will be reallocated for other grant applicants.
- Applicants must provide proof of payment (receipts, paid invoices, etc.) for all eligible enhancements within 30 days of project completion. Reimbursement for approved facade renovations is subject to final inspection. Project costs are subject to audit by the City of Surrey.
