SUBJECT: Funding Request - Sarah McLachlan School of Music

#### RECOMMENDATION

The Finance and Technology Department recommends that Council approve the following:

- 1. Receive this report as information; and
- 2. Approve a funding request of \$30,000 from the Council Initiatives Fund to the Sarah McLachlan School of Music Surrey Program, with \$15,000 being reimbursed to the Fund from the Surrey Fire Fighters Charitable Society.

#### **INTENT**

The purpose of this report is to request that Mayor and Council support a funding request from the Council Initiatives fund to support the Sarah McLachlan School of Music in Surrey.

#### **BACKGROUND**

The Sarah McLachlan School of Music (SoM) provides professional music instruction at no cost, in a safe and nurturing environment, for at-risk and underserved children, youth, and adults. Funded entirely through private donations, students aged 1 to 5, grades 4 through 12, and age 55+ receive high quality music instruction in both contemporary and classical traditions with no previous experience required.

Benefits of the project to its participants include: improved memory and creative expression; confidence and social skill building; essential life skill development such as discipline, self-control, perseverance and patience; engagement in collaborative and self-directed learning.

Over the last year, the Sarah McLachlan School of Music has been actively working on the prospect of providing quality music programming to at-risk children and youth in Surrey. Surrey School District staff and Board members have been instrumental in helping SoM find the schools of greatest need where they can have the most impact. It was determined that the best way for SoM to start in Surrey would be with after-school programs at three elementary schools – Mary Jane Shannon, Forsyth Road and Holly Elementary.

This service delivery model provides SoM the opportunity to determine how the music school can work more efficiently with other community partners, allowing for a broader collective reach for as many at-risk children and youth as possible.

#### **DISCUSSION**

The SoM's goal for the funding of this program is to raise \$100,000 for the first year of start-up. This would cover the salary expenses for the music instructors, the administrative staff who will be assigned to the start-up project, and the cost of the equipment for the three schools. In year two, the SoM anticipates the programming costs to remain at \$100,000 and the number of students in the program to double. As the program grows in Surrey, the operating costs will grow at the same rate as the students' numbers.

The SoM is fortunate to receive support from the Sarah McLachlan Foundation that covers its overhead costs. This means that donors in Surrey are funding the program costs of the Surrey program only.

### **Funding**

The School of Music is funded entirely through private donations. Private donations support the direct costs of providing music education - music instruction, instruments and supplies to maintain the year-round attendance needed for the full benefits of music education.

All funds raised that are designated for SoM Surrey, will be used for the programming and equipment costs for Surrey only. Staff is recommending that Council support the SoM with \$30,000 from the Council Initiative fund, with \$15,000 being reimbursed to the City from the Surrey Fire Fighters Charitable Society . Appendix "I" attached to this report provides information on the balance of the Council Initiatives Fund on the assumption that Council will approve the recommendation of this report.

#### **SUSTAINABILITY CONSIDERATIONS**

The SoM supports the overall objectives of the City's Sustainability Charter, specifically by creating a safe and secure environment for the City's residents, businesses and visitors. The priorities and objectives outlined in the framework are well aligned with the following Charter action items:

- SC5: Plan for the Social Well-Being of Surrey Residents
- SC17: Crime Reduction Strategy

#### **CONCLUSION**

One of the greatest successes at SoM is assisting its students in "finding their voices" through music. The outcome of the program is for students to stay in school, to increase the likelihood of them to succeed in their studies and to ultimately graduate from high school.

Based on the above discussion, it is recommended that Council approve a funding request of \$30,000 from the Council Initiatives Fund, with \$15,000 being reimbursed from the Surrey Fire Fighters Charitable Society, to the Sarah McLachlan School of Music – Surrey program in support of the development of the music school being established in Surrey.
