#### RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that Council receive this report for information.

#### **INTENT**

The intent of this report is to update Council on the planning and collaboration between the City and School District #36 which helps School District #36 staff prepare their five year capital plan for the Province's consideration and funding, in order to address the projected growth of the School District.

#### BACKGROUND

#### Land Use Plans

Planning & Development Department staff collaborate with School District #36 ("School District") staff on a regular basis. This ensures School District staff participation in the preparation of land use plans, which allows for planning the location and type of new schools that are anticipated to be required to accommodate the projected student population the future growth will generate.

As such, new Neighbourhood Concept Plans (NCPs) will include potential properties for acquisition that will be required to deliver those new schools. The land use plan includes generate projections for the type of dwelling units that are anticipated within the NCP. This helps School District staff to draw their student population projections which guides the establishment of their capital plans.

#### School Catchment Projections

In addition to NCP areas, Planning & Development Department staff also provide dwelling unit estimates, both current and projected, for all of Surrey. This information includes growth forecasts of new housing units organized by housing type. The City also provides estimates on the percentage of single family houses which include secondary suites.

Since 2008, this information has been broken down to show the existing and projected unit counts for each elementary and secondary school catchment area. These expanded projections estimate growth in dwelling units up to the year 2046.

In 2015, a second Geographical Information System (GIS) component was added to the information made available to the School District. This information shows the "development capacity remaining" for each lot in the City, according to the existing zoning and designation as per the approved plans. This GIS data is also broken down by each elementary and secondary school catchment area.

#### DISCUSSION

With the projected population growth, anticipated dwelling unit types, and added GIS information, School District staff then use their student projection tools to prepare their capital plan.

The current School District five year capital plan, submitted June 2017 for consideration by the Province, includes additions to existing schools, new schools (both elementary and secondary), and new site acquisitions for future schools.

Those projects included in the current plan are listed below, with additional details on Appendix "I" and "II."

These projects are at different stages of approval with the Province, and represent the large capital projects currently underway or planned for Surrey schools.

Currently the School District has a total of 321 portable classrooms located throughout the City. This number is not projected to decrease in the short term, as capital projects take on average two to four years from Provincial approval to completion and opening. Compounding the pressure on classrooms was the Supreme Court decision on maximum class sizes in British Columbia. School District #36 staff had to ensure class size and composition met the legal requirements, which created an added pressure on classroom space.

It is not possible to predict at this time when the number of portable classrooms will start to decrease given the level of uncertainty around the timing of future capital project funding approvals by the provincial government.

It is important for Planning & Development Department staff to continue to collaborate closely with School District staff in order to ensure the projected student growths are taken into account as School District staff prepare and revise their five year plan, which is done on a yearly basis. The next five year capital plan update will be finalized in June 2018. This will ensure that Provincial staff that are responsible to consider capital investments are kept up to date with current and future needs for Surrey schools.

#### SUSTAINABILITY CONSIDERATIONS

School District #36's capital planning process is informed by Planning & Development staff. This collaboration relates to the Sustainability Charter 2.0 Desired Outcomes (DO) and Strategic Directions (SD) as follows.

#### **Education and Culture**

- **DO2:** Surrey children and youth have access to a high quality comprehensive and inclusive educational system, and opportunities that include experiences in and out of school.
- **DO5:** Surrey's educational institutions and libraries are integrated into the community, and have sufficient capacity to accommodate residents as well as attract people from other areas.
- **SD1:** Support the expansion of education opportunities, including increased space and schools for students and niche programs only available in Surrey.
- **SD7:** Promote collaboration between public partners, educational institutions, arts and heritage groups, and the community.

#### CONCLUSION

Planning & Development Department and School District #36 staff collaborate closely to ensure both current student population and projected enrollment are reviewed on a regular basis, which in turn informs the capital needs for Surrey schools.

It is recommended that Council receive this report for information.
