SUBJECT: License Agreement with Rogers Communications Canada Inc. for Use of Road Allowances on 82A Avenue West of 132 Street and on 132 Street North of 72 Avenue

RECOMMENDATION

The Engineering Department recommends that Council:

1. Receive this report as information; and
2. Authorize the Mayor and the City Clerk to execute a license agreement with Rogers Communications Canada Inc. ("Rogers") that will act to grant Rogers a non-exclusive right to install, operate and maintain telecommunications infrastructure for a ten-year period within the road allowances on 82A Avenue west of 132 Street and on 132 Street north of 72 Avenue as illustrated on Appendices "I" and "II" attached to this report.

INTENT

The intent of this report is to obtain Council's approval to execute a license agreement with Rogers for the use of the road allowances on 82A Avenue west of 132 Street and on 132 Street north of 72 Avenue.

BACKGROUND

Rogers has approached the City for permission to install, operate and maintain underground telecommunication infrastructure within the road allowance as illustrated on Appendices "I" and "II." This infrastructure will allow Rogers to provide expanded telecommunication service in Surrey. Prior to these installations, Rogers must enter into a license agreement with the City for the use of the road allowances on 82A Avenue west of 132 Street and on 132 Street north of 72 Avenue.

DISCUSSION

The City has entered into site-specific license agreements with other telecommunications carriers including A2B, Allstream, AT&T, Bell Canada, Bell Mobility, and Persona/Eastlink.

The Legal Services Division has confirmed that it has reviewed the license agreement and has no concerns.

SUSTAINABILITY CONSIDERATIONS

The license agreement supports the objectives of the City's Sustainability Charter. In particular, the Rogers works relate to the Sustainability Charter theme of Infrastructure. Specifically, the license agreement supports the following Desired Outcome (DO):

- Telecommunications DO21: The City has excellent communications infrastructure that provides affordable and effective connectivity across the community.

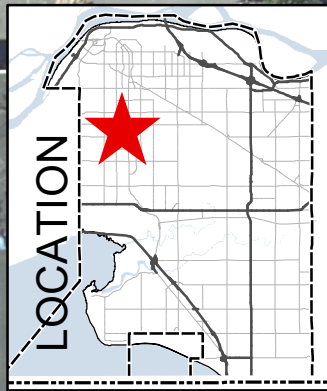
CONCLUSION
