CATEGORY 1 - PAINTING - WORKS ON CANVAS

Sean Mills - Untitled

An understanding of light and its interaction with matter are important to how the work functions. The diffusion of light, as it travels through varying depths of a clear acrylic, acts to control the tonality of equivalent white acrylic applications at differing levels within the painting's surface.

Om Atman - You are That

In this painting I try to express and illustrate the most profound, highest spiritual Truth, that declares: "Man is not the body, senses, intellect, ego nor mind; He is the Spirit and not individual, but Universal Spirit". This One Universal, Infinite Spirit transcends; and is devoid of any qualities, any attributes, so from the level of the mind It is "Emptiness" or "Nothingness" (symbolized by cut out circle). Out of this "Emptiness" or "Nothingness", periodically Creation, the Universe, arises as we are experiencing one presently. After all uncountable experiences and adventures in the material spheres, ultimate destiny of Man is to merge, to reunite, with that One Universal Spirit.

Carolyn Doan - St. Jeannet Winery, France

There is a small, exquisite winery found nestled amongst the hills, not far from the ancient walled city of Vence in the South of France. This painting depicts the work of generations of a single family whose daily life unfolds beneath the Mediterranean sun and rising mist, at the base of Mt. St. Jeannet

Frank Bennett - Sales Team

The faces in this painting have an interesting story to tell. Lines, colors, shapes and expressions are used to bring that story to the viewer.

CATEGORY 2 - PAINTING - WORKS ON PAPER

Jongkook Kim - Peaceful Autumn

One day in autumn I was looking at nature while sitting on the rocks in the ocean, and felt warmth and peace flowing within my heart and tried to capture the peaceful moments into my painting.

Hazel Breitkrutz - Claudette

It's summer. Claudette arrives with elegance, sophistication and melancholy, for High Tea with friends. Pleasantries are shared as light falls across Claudette's face creating a mask-like moment of mystery, mimicking the mystery of friendship.

Maria Kaminska - Iris

My inspiration is the beauty of nature; my favourite subjects are landscapes and flowers. I enjoy working with watercolour and oil in my garden where this iris grows.

CATEGORY 3 - DRAWING, 2-D MIXED MEDIA & PRINTMAKING

Mehran Modarres-Sadeghi - Her Childhood Memories

This piece was inspired by a young girl's memories of war and whose love of drawing pictures and colouring helped her to overcome her fears.

Shinyoung Park - Untitled

This mosaic etching piece was inspired by reminiscing of my childhood when I used to chase after dragonflies. Not only are my childhood memories beginning to fade, but it is also getting harder and harder to chase dragonflies these days.

Deborah Strong - Urban Flock

Many species of wild bird adapt well to urban life, few more-so than the ever-present Mallard duck. This flock was observed gobbling seed scattered for their benefit on a paved pathway in a local park, and I was engaged by the colourful visual rhythm of their bright orange feet and the males' iridescent green heads.

Kathleen Gaitt - Tyrescape 1

Tracks left by man's machines can alter surfaces, but usually become invisible and forgotten over time. Sometimes, layers of remembering surface and we glimpse the past...

CATEGORY 4 – 3-D WORKS & FIBRE ARTS

Elizabeth Carefoot - My Totems

Men of many tribes carve totem poles and place them outside their lodges to act as guardians. My "totems" are knitted as a way to honour women, who also protect and safeguard home and family.

Li Chuan Chang - My Pets

My pets keep me busy, but make me happy.

Bonnie McKibbin - A Child's Garden of Verses

Remove any space for uncertainty - leave only a space for what you want to have been.

Evan Leung - Destination

At our young age, we believe everything is under our control and will go with our plans; however, with one incident, our precious lives can be taken easily with or without notice. Death, we will experience it sooner or later, the terrified moment is that when we are lying on the bed with different medical equipment, plastic tubes connected to our vein, our throat to our body in order to survive, which is the most painful experience in both mentally and physically until the time is up. Each individual has its own story, and not everything is in our control, but at least one thing in common, death, is the same path we will go through, so let's take the lead and enjoy our precious moment before it's time.

Gail Stephan - Dandelion Details

The beauty and wonder of Nature can be found in the most simple of things. It is when we stop and take a closer look that we may appreciate the most humble of Life's creations.

JURORS' STATEMENT

Entering a room of 170 artworks can be, at first, an intimidating experience. The first view is an expanse of colours and shapes. Quickly though, one's focus sharpens upon the task at hand.

From the outset, we were delighted by the diversity of media and artistic processes. Viewing these works is exciting and edifying, seeing how artists are working to create their visions. We decided that we should strive to include a range of works, from traditional to experimental and across the various media, to reflect the submissions.

With this year's submissions, there was a noticeable increase in the number of photographic works as well as three-dimensional pieces presented for adjudication. We strove to ensure that this was reflected in the final selection.

Our criteria included technical competence, a clear intention or idea expressed in the artwork, and an appreciation of originality. All artworks were carefully examined by us individually, and we reviewed the proposed artworks many times before collectively making the difficult decision of selecting the number that would be installed in the exhibit halls.

Over the history of the annual juried show, the artwork has continued to reflect both the diversity of the region's artists, and the issues and ideas that inform contemporary life – political, physical and emotional. Many artists were interested in pushing boundaries. This was reflected in the work of both established as well as emerging artists participating in this exhibition.

We would like to thank all of the artists who submitted work for this exhibition. We saw many more wonderful works than could be accommodated.

This exhibition is made possible by artists, who organize and serve on the committee, who volunteer to receive and return artwork and support the adjudication process. We thank everyone who made this possible.

All of those who come to view this exhibition reinforce the importance of having art in our lives, and to see work by artists in the Metro Vancouver region. We hope you enjoy the opportunity to view these diverse artworks, as much as we have
