# Terms of Reference: Impact Assessment Reports

Trees and Landscape Section

### **Background:**

Tree Protection Bylaw, 2006, No. 16100

Impact assessment reports are required when a bylaw protected tree has been damaged or there is suspected damage to a bylaw protected tree.

Investigations for an Impact Assessment shall be carried out in a similar manner to a Level 3 TRAQ Assessment. The report should have a clear outcome. Potential outcomes could be:

- 1. the tree should be removed
- 2. no damage has occurred; the tree can be retained
- 3. the tree has been damaged; mitigation work is required
- 4. minor damage has occurred; no mitigation work is required; the tree can be retained
- 5. minor damage has occurred; mitigation was completed during the investigation; the tree can be retained

#### **Arborist:**

An Arborist is defined in the Tree Protection Bylaw as a person who is both an International Society of Arboriculture Certified Arborist and an International Society of Arboriculture Qualified Tree Risk Assessor.

	Rationale for removal (if applicable)
	Description of the recommended mitigation work (if applicable)
	Photo of the entire tree and photo(s) that show the investigation work
	Details of the advanced tree risk assessment methods or tools used in the investigation
