A long exposure time captured the idyllic suburban street, the dark office space, and myself juxtaposed into a single moment.

Who says testing equipment cannot be fun? Here we worked with a 4x5 camera, slow shutter combined with flash to see how much light we intake. The results show clear results, with a nice self reflecting but FUN outcome!
