

# Outdoor Burning Safety



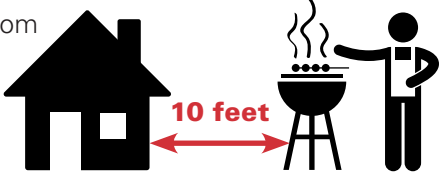
## WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

- No open burning is allowed in Surrey. This includes cooking fires, campfires, and burning garbage.
- You cannot use chimineas or similar products designed for wood burning.
- You can use natural gas, propane, or charcoal briquettes if they are used in ULC/ CSA approved devices for the specific product.
- Outdoor burning of materials that are related to the continuation of farming is only permitted during the period of Oct 1 to April 30 on land that has been classified as Farm/Agricultural land by BC Assessment, are actively engaged in agriculture/farming, and possess a valid permit issued by Surrey Fire Services.

**WARNING: Not following any/all of Surrey's burning regulations may lead to cost recovery charges for Fire Service attendance.**

## SAFE DISTANCES

- Barbecuing must be 10 feet away from buildings or structures.



## BARBECUE SAFETY

- Never leave your barbecue unattended, even for a short time.
- Remove grease buildup from the barbecue trays below the grill.



## PROPANE SAFETY

- Properly secure propane so it doesn't fall over.
- If you smell gas or discover a fire, immediately back away and call 9-1-1.
